This Membership Agreement (the Agreement) is effective upon membership payment by and between the Society of Allied Weight Engineers, Inc., hereinafter referred to as SAWE, accessed via www.sawe.org with a business address of 5734 E. Lucia Walk, Long Beach, California 90803, and all current and future individual, corporate or company members (hereinafter referred to as Members) of SAWE.

1. Membership Classification

The membership of the Society shall consist of Honorary Fellows, Fellows, Charter Members, Members, Student Members, Retired Members, Corporate Partners, and Corporate Members (hereinafter referred to as Corporate Members), and Benefactors. The specific qualifications of each membership grade are as follows:

HONORARY FELLOWS shall be persons who have achieved eminence in mass properties engineering, or who have made outstanding contributions to the advancement of the Society.

FELLOWS shall be persons who have achieved distinction in mass properties engineering, or who have materially contributed to the advancement of the Society.
